The decision will be taken at the AGM unless the members decide to use some other procedure. I would like to have made this a matter for the whole membership rather than just those attending the AGM but that would involve an expensive mail voting process and, unless the AGM feels it is justified, we will not do it.

I would like to express my appreciation to the whole Executive, especially Howard Fink and Colin Waters as well as our various newsletter editors, for their support over the years. It has been an honour to serve you as your President for these seven years.
